"Adopt Perspective" podcasts

Jigsaw Qld's Adopt Perspective Podcast is no longer a fledgling podcast. By the time of the AGM we'd reached 7000 listeners worldwide and produced 23 episodes in 2021, bringing our two-season total to 44 episodes. Our top countries of reach are Australia, closely followed by the USA. Keeping to our mix of personal stories interspersed with interviews with professionals, authors, filmmakers etc, we have continued to receive glowing
feedback from clients, stakeholders and others affected by adoption around the world.

This year we interviewed psychotherapist Pam Cordano, Lost and Found singer / songwriters, Cath Mundy \& Jay Turner, Professor Daryl Higgins, former MP Anne Warner, Ruth Loli from Link Up Qld, Lynelle Long from ICAV, filmmaker Rebecca Autumn Sansom and mothers and fathers who lost children to adoption and adopted people. We covered many topics including; discharging adoptions and adoption and addiction.

The podcasts help to promote FASS services and encourage people to seek support during the COVID crisis and also reach people who cannot attend face to face support groups e.g. those living in regional areas.
